Leviticus 19.1-2, 9-18

The LORD spoke to Moses, saying:

<sup>2</sup> Speak to all the congregation of the people of Israel and say to them: You shall be holy, for I the LORD your God am holy.

<sup>9</sup> When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap to the very edges of your field, or gather the gleanings of your harvest. <sup>10</sup> You shall not strip your vineyard bare, or gather the fallen grapes of your vineyard; you shall leave them for the poor and the alien: I am the LORD your God.

<sup>11</sup> You shall not steal; you shall not deal falsely; and you shall not lie to one another. <sup>12</sup> And you shall not swear falsely by my name, profaning the name of your God: I am the LORD.

Lent begins this week and we enter the desert with Jesus. St Mark records that the Spirit drove Jesus and we don't need to imagine his reluctance – we feel it often when faced with a task or responsibility that is uncomfortable, even dreaded. Leaning back, heels dug in, we are pushed to face some home truths. The topic of Fair Trade demands that we look at our responsibility when it comes to how goods are distributed and sold. Lord, give us courage to ask ourselves if the food and clothing we buy has meant hunger and exploitation for others, and destruction of their culture and livelihood.

The righteous know the rights of the poor; the wicked have no such understanding. Proverbs 29:7
We give thanks for members' work that upholds the values of fair trade, helping people and their communities to take control of their lives with dignity. We ask God's blessing on their environmental protection work so that farming will

flourish despite the challenges of climate change.
